# Associate in Applied Science in Nursing: LPN Articulation Option

Will Earn Upon Program Completion: Associate in Applied Science (A.A.S.) Degree

The LPN Articulation Option of the Nursing program provides an opportunity for Licensed Practical Nurses to gain credit for previous LPN education and licensure toward completion of the Nursing A.A.S. degree program. The nursing program prepares the student for entry-level positions in hospitals and other health care facilities. Upon completion of the program, the student is eligible to sit for the NCLEX-RN exam to qualify for licensure.

#### Notes:

- (1) Upon successful completion of <u>NRS 106</u> and <u>NRS 111</u>, the LPN will be awarded <u>NRS 999</u> (6 credits) for their LPN education toward the Nursing degree.
- (2) The minimum passing grade for all courses designated BIO, CHM, MTH or NRS is "C." If you earn a grade below "C", you need to repeat that course.
- (3) Students accepted into the Nursing: LPN Articulation Option program begin with NRS 106, which begins in January.
- (4) Students enrolled in the Nursing program will be required to submit to criminal background checks, drug screen, health clearance, and CPR certification in connection with their clinical placement at certain health care organizations. All expenses for criminal background checks, health clearance, and CPR certification are the responsibility of the student.
