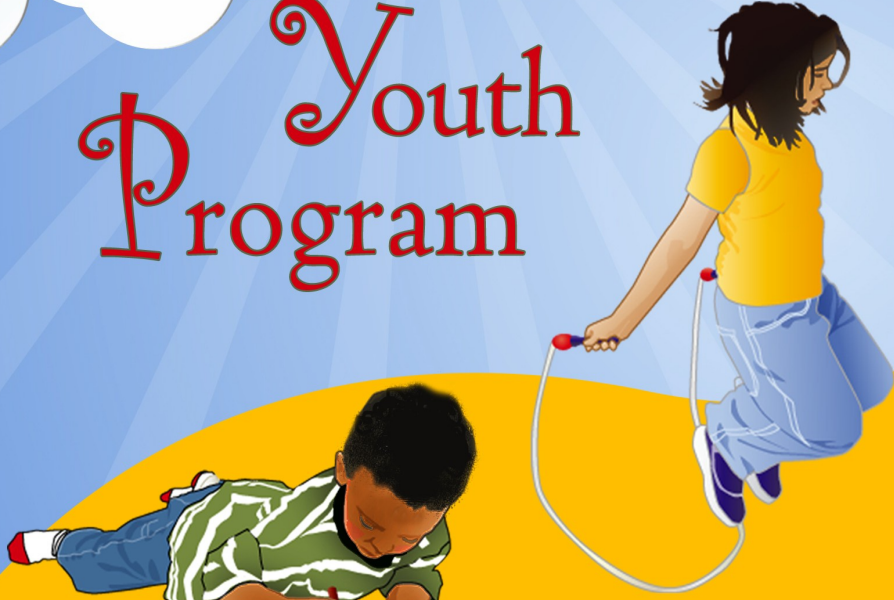

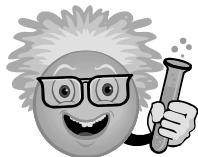
ABOUT THE PROGRAM . . .

Each summer, the On-Campus Continuing Education Department opens its doors to many children entering grades 1 - 6 as of September. Our Summer Youth Program provides academic instruction, recreation and cultural indoor and outdoor activities.

Participants have a choice of programs that offer math, reading, writing, recreation, dance, acting, artistic skills, arts & crafts, computer, science, sports, and much more. Computer lab time and recreation is also incorporated in the daily schedule.

Our indoor and outdoor activities play an integral part in the youth program. These unique experiences can encourage lifelong learning, enthusiasm and commitment to service, self-confidence, and a stronger sense of community among participants.

We have been fortunate enough to see many of our previous participants grow up and accomplish their goals by being successful students in high school and/or college. As a result, we believe that our summer program is very beneficial in the lives of those who attend.

PROGRAM INFORMATION . . .

TUITION



We have kept the cost at a modest level. The tuition includes Friday field trips, breakfast, lunch and a program T-shirt. Youth can be registered for two-week sessions - \$325; and/or three-week sessions - \$475. Tuition is based on per session. **Family discount:** If you register two or more children (siblings) in a family, **you can save 10% on tuition (ONLY)** for the second child and any additional siblings.

MATERIALS

Participants will be required to bring basic supplies such as a notebook, pen, pencil, crayons, etc. Details will be provided during the parent meeting. In addition, there are countless materials and supplies that the department provides which are utilized to aid in the instruction for the various programs. **Therefore, we charge a \$10 fee per student/per session to offset some of these costs. No discounts on material fees.**



T-SHIRTS

One t-shirt is included in the tuition cost. Extra t-shirts can be purchased for an additional \$10.00. T-shirts must be worn on Field Trip days and Picture day (will be announced in advanced).

FIELD TRIPS

Every Friday from 8:30am - 4:00pm, youth will board an air-conditioned bus, chaperoned by their teachers and staff, for a day of educational and fun activities. **NOTE:** during the summer months, the college will be closed on Fridays. **Therefore, a \$10 late fee will be charged if your child is not picked up by 4:00pm.**



AFTER-CARE

All students **MUST BE PICKED UP** Monday - Thursday by 4:00pm. If you **WISH** to have your child stay after regular program hours, you must register him/her for **After-Care for an additional \$25/week**. This service is available Monday through Thursday. **NOTE: THERE IS NO AFTER-CARE ON FRIDAYS.**

CAMP DISCOVERY

This two-week program will give children preparing for first grade an academic foundation as they discover the joys of learning. Phonics, reading, math, science and penmanship will be addressed along with creative arts, computers, and recreation.

AGES 8 - 12 (as of TODAY)



Everyone loves music, but before the digital revolution it used to take years of practice on an instrument to create even simple songs. Now the power of technology empowers everyone, regardless of experience, with the opportunity to create their own songs, soundtracks, podcasts or music videos. Using tools similar to Garage Band and other mass media software, youth will explore the basics of song composition, editing tracks, and creating a video in two weeks. Student created songs, music video, and podcasts will be available on a password protected website to share with family and friends. *Students should bring their own earphones.* Program offered in conjunction with **Black Rocket Productions.**

COMPUTER BLASTER

Session I: Grades 5 - 6 • Session II: Grades 2 - 3 • Session III: Grades 4 - 5

GRADES 2-6 (as of Sept.)

Children learn many things in a variety of ways. By learning computers they will discover tools and ideas for using technology effectively in their regular classroom situation and daily activities. This educational and enjoyable two-week program designed for beginners and proficient youth includes Keyboarding, PowerPoint, Computer Graphics, Internet, as well as fun and recreational activities. Keep in mind that computers will be important for your children's future success in the technology field.



EDUCATIONAL PROGRAM

GRADES 2-6 (as of Sept.)

This program offers two-weeks of academic enrichment for students entering the second through sixth grades in September. Program design is based on the premise that learning can be fun. AGES 8 - 15 (current)

ATTENTION ALL DANCERS & PERFORMERS

This program offers two-weeks of dance and acting for students with an interest in theatrical expression. Instruction will consist of dance classes in ballet and modern musical theatre jazz, along with fundamentals in acting and script reading. Participants will see the dance and drama come to life as they display their talent in a final performance at the end of each two-week session. *Leotard, tights and ballet slippers required.*



GOLF & TENNIS

It is never too late to start the games of golf and tennis. This program invites boys and girls at all skills levels that have not played golf or tennis but show an interest in the games. The goal is to develop basic sport skills, instill good sportsmanship and self-discipline to become the best player possible.

MONEY MATTERS

This financial program will introduce children to the key concepts and practices of wise money management using familiar terms and interesting examples. Financial knowledge can give children different perspectives on how to count, spend and save money in a useful way. Help your child to take advantage of his/her future earning years.

Session II: Grades 5 - 6

This three-week program is designed to foster reading appreciation skills among participants and stress the enjoyment that can result from any reading style. Youth will develop literal, interpretive and evaluative skills through book reports, projects and computer activities. This program includes instruction in reading, writing, computers and creative arts.



SCIENCE IN A NUTSHELL

GRADES 4-6 (as of Sept.)

Children will go nuts over science while investigating, observing, discovering and exploring the world around them. This three-week program will provide creative hands-on activities, experiments, projects and games that will reinforce science concepts.

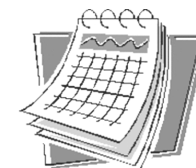

MEALS

Breakfast and lunch will be provided to participants enrolled in the program. A daily menu will be provided during the parent meeting and anytime thereafter. Be sure to review the menu everyday. Children should bring their own breakfast/lunch if they will not be eating what is on the menu on any given day. If your child is allergic to any food item, you must provide a substitute and this information should be noted on the Health History/Medical Form. **There will not be any meals served on Fridays (Field Trip days). Children must bring their own lunch.**

DROP-OFF LOCATION

Students must be dropped off in the Cafeteria, 2nd Floor, during the arrival time period (8:15am - 8:50am). **DO NOT BRING ANY STUDENTS TO THE OFFICE DURING THIS TIME.**

PICK-UP LOCATION

Students must be picked-up between the noted dismissal time (4:05pm - 4:15pm) from their classroom, unless they are enrolled in After-Care. Classroom location will be provided at a later date.

If your child needs to be picked up early, you must contact/stop by the office (Continuing Education Dept., 3rd Floor, Green Area). Since program schedules rotate throughout the day, participants will not be at the regular dismissal location until 4pm. Therefore, it is necessary to pick up him/her from the office. Advanced notice would be appreciated.

AUTHORIZED PICK-UP

Names and phone #'s of authorized individuals for pick-up must be provided. These persons must also show ID upon arrival. A form will be provided in-person and during the parent meeting.

AFTER-CARE REGISTRATION FORM (page 14)

This form can be completed in advance or in-person. In-person, your child needs to be signed-up and payment made the Wednesday prior to the week he/she will be attending.

HEALTH HISTORY/MEDICAL FORM (page 13)

This form must be completed, listing all allergies, signed (by parent), and returned with a CURRENT copy of the child's immunization record from their Physician. **NOTE:** If a child needs medications by injections or an allergy kit, the child or Parent/guardian must administer that medication. In addition, if an asthma inhaler needs to be used, the participant must be able to self-administer, and it must be labeled with his/her name and kept with the participant during program hours.

STUDENT CONDUCT AGREEMENT (must be picked-up in person)

Upon registration, this form will be given. It should be reviewed by the parent with each participant enrolling in the program. This is an agreement between participant, parent and department which states appropriate/acceptable behavior for each participant to follow during the duration of the program. All participants and parents must read and sign this agreement and return prior to start of their program.
