Choose five of the following art courses: <u>ART 101</u> Art History I, <u>ART 108</u> Life Drawing, <u>ART 110</u> Sculpture, <u>ART 111</u> Fundamentals of Painting, <u>ART 119</u> Museums and Galleries, <u>ART 140</u> Photography, <u>ART 161</u> Computer-Enhanced Layout and Design, <u>ART 163</u> Digital Video Graphic Design, <u>ART 167</u> Introduction to Computer Art, <u>ART 168</u> Desktop Publishing/Presentation Graphics, <u>ART 169</u> Advanced Computer Graphics, and/or <u>ART 171</u> Cyberspace Graphics and Beginning Animation (five 3-credit courses)
