International students applicants currently residing in the United States must bring their passport with Form I-94 and any other documentation that may have been received from USCIS to the International Student Office located in the Enrollment Services at the Newark campus. Deadline for Application for Admission for the Fall Semester is July 1st. Deadline for Application for the Spring Semester is November 1st.

Every applicant accepted to Essex County College must take a placement test for English and Math prior to registering for classes. You will not be able to register until you have taken this placement test. One or more of the tests may be waived if you can provide documentation..

HOW TO APPLY Step 1. Apply for Admission by completing and submitting this application. All applications must include the following:

 Completed and signed application form \$30 non-refundable application fee. The application fee must be in the form of a check or money order. The application fee must be in United States dollars and drawn on a United States bank.
 Proof of high school graduation. (Reviewed and evaluated by an evaluation service) Test scores (TOEFL-ibt, TOEFL, SAT, ACT, Accuplacer) or copy of college transcript. Completed and signed application for Form I-20
Notarized Sponsor's Affidavit of Financial Support with required evidence.
Notarized Sponsor's Affidavit of Free Room and Board with required evidence (if applicable).
Step 2. Application is reviewed. Upon approval, an acceptance letter and Form I-20 will be sent to you. You will also receive information about the International Student Orientation and Registration dates.
Step 3. Apply for your passport as soon as possible. Some countries prohibit their citizens from applying for a passport before receiving the Form I-20. If you have that problem, you should apply for college admission as soon as possible.
Upon receipt of your passport and F-1 student visa:
Step 1. Attend the International Student Orientation. Take the Placement Test. This test will be used to determine the level of your English and Math classes for the first semester, so please take it seriously. If you have questions regarding the test, please contact the International Student Advisor at 973.877.3207 or 973.877.3154.
Step 2. Register for Classes.
Payment is due 24 hours after registration or your registration will be voided. Please note that International Students are not eligible for the in-county tuition rate.
