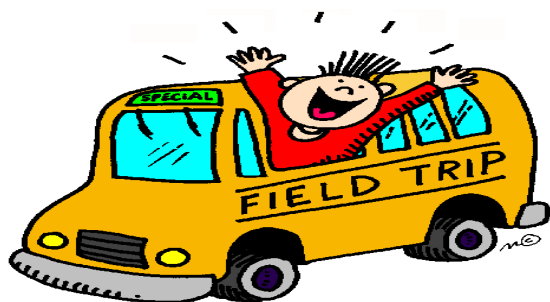

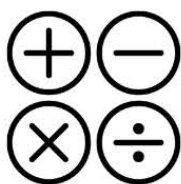

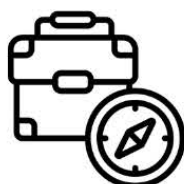

Seton Hall University – SUMMER INSTITUTE FOR PRE-LEGAL STUDIES –

May 28 – July 1, 2023

This is a unique opportunity for EOF students! Seriously consider how you can take advantage of it!

- ▶ The **Pre-Legal Program** is a five-week, residential, skill-building program which requires a total commitment of time and energy. Courses are offered in legal writing, legal analysis, written communication and substantive areas of the law such as contracts, property, agency, or constitutional law.
- ▶ Classes are scheduled from **9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Friday**. Additional class sessions, time and stress management skills programs, and career orientation workshops are scheduled on evenings and weekends.
- ▶ Law classes are taught by law school faculty and by practicing attorneys. Class attendance is mandatory. Like law school, Pre-Legal is a full-time commitment.

Frequent questions:

Q. *Do I have to reside on the main campus even if I live close to the main campus?*

A. *Yes.*

Q. *When does the Pre-Legal Program start and end?*

A. *The residential component of the 2023 Pre-Legal Program is tentatively scheduled to run from May 28th – July 1st. The Pre-Legal Program also consists of a series of three full Saturdays in March, April and May. (Classes and other mandatory activities will take place from 8:00 a.m. – 7:00 p.m. on each Saturday.)*

The dates of the specific Saturdays will be provided on or about March 1, 2023.

**** All participants who are accepted into the Pre-Legal Program are accepted conditionally. Participants who do not attend and complete the three full Saturdays will not be offered the opportunity to participate in the residential component of the Pre-Legal Program.**

Q. *Am I responsible for my own meals?*

A. *The Pre-Legal Program provides “Pirates Gold” funds of approximately \$15 - \$17 per day. The “Pirates Gold” can be used at a number of different dining establishments in the South Orange area. Meals at the Law School are usually catered at no expense to Participants. Participants are responsible for all costs in excess of the daily allowance.*

**** “Pirates Gold” is the card issued by the University for meals on the SHU Main Campus.**

The exact amount of the daily allowance is based on budgetary considerations and will be provided prior to the start of the Pre-Legal Program.

In order to promote careers in State and local government, the NJ Civil Service Commission, Office of Diversity Programs has scheduled a series of virtual information sessions.
