Ford Federal Direct Loan (Direct Loan) program, and other U.S. Department of Education programs. The NSLDS database provides a centralized, integrated view of federal student aid loans and grants that are tracked through their entire lifecycle from aid approval through disbursement and repayment (if applicable). Student Complaints Resources

As noted in the publication LIFELINE, the Student Handbook produced by Student Life and Activities, for student complaints in academic affairs:

if a student has an issue with a faculty member (other than a Grade Appeal), the following procedures should be followed:

1. The student should meet with the faculty member and attempt to resolve the issue.
2. If a resolution is not reached, the student should make an appointment to meet with the Chairperson of the Division / Department.
3. The issue will be addressed in the Division/Department by the Chairperson.
4. In those cases where the conflict is not resolved, the Chairperson will forward the matter to the office of Academic Affairs-Dean of Faculty for final resolution.

Basic Needs Resources

Many students may need additional assistance beyond student financial assistance to help with food, utilities, and other basic needs. Students may be eligible for other human services programs to help reduce or even cover such additional expenses. Are you a student, age 18 to 49 enrolled at least half-time in a college, university, community college, or business, technical, trade, or vocational school that requires a high school diploma?

If so, you may be eligible for food assistance through New Jersey's Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP). SNAP is a federal

program that can help individuals and families with low incomes buy the groceries they need to eat healthy. Eligibility depends on several factors like income, household size, resources, etc.

In addition to income eligibility factors, students also must fit at least ONE of the following requirements:

- Be enrolled in an approved Career and Technical Education Program at a New Jersey community college;
- Be employed at least 20 hours per week AND paid for such work;
- Be participating in a federal work study program during the school year;
- Be participating in an on-the-job training program;
- Be responsible for the care of a member of your household who is a dependent under the age of six years-old;
- Be a single parent enrolled full-time AND responsible for a dependent under the age 12 years-old;
- Be unable to work due to a physical or mental disability; or
- Be receiving Work First New Jersey (WFNJ) Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) benefits (cash assistance).

Recursos para quejas de estudiantes

Como se indica en la publicación LIFELINE, el Manual del estudiante producido por Vida y actividades estudiantiles, para las quejas de los estudiantes en asuntos académicos:

Si un estudiante tiene un problema con un miembro de la facultad (que no sea una Apelación de calificación), se deben seguir los siguientes procedimientos:

1. El estudiante debe reunirse con el miembro de la facultad e intentar resolver el problema.
2. Si no se llega a una resolución, el estudiante debe hacer una cita para reunirse con el Director de la División / Departamento.
3. El presidente abordará el problema en la División / Departamento.
4. En aquellos casos en que no se resuelva el conflicto, el Presidente remitirá el asunto a la Oficina de Asuntos Académicos-Decano de Facultad para su resolución final.

¿Es usted un estudiante de 18 a 49 años inscrito al menos medio tiempo en un colegio, universidad, colegio comunitario o escuela comercial, técnica, comercial o vocacional que requiere un diploma de escuela secundaria?



Si es así, puede ser elegible para recibir asistencia alimentaria a través del Programa de Asistencia Nutricional Suplementaria (SNAP) de Nueva Jersey. SNAP es un programa federal que puede ayudar a las personas y familias de bajos ingresos a comprar los alimentos que necesitan para comer de manera saludable. La elegibilidad depende de varios factores como los ingresos, el tamaño del hogar, los recursos, etc.

Además de los factores de elegibilidad de ingresos, los estudiantes también deben cumplir con al menos UNO de los siguientes requisitos:

- Estar inscrito en un Programa de Educación Técnica y Profesional aprobado en un colegio comunitario de Nueva Jersey;
- Estar empleado al menos 20 horas por semana Y remunerado por dicho trabajo;
- Participar en un programa de trabajo y estudio federal durante el año escolar;
- Participar en un programa de capacitación en el trabajo;
- Ser responsable del cuidado de un miembro de su hogar que sea dependiente menor de seis años;
- Ser un padre soltero inscrito a tiempo completo Y responsable de un dependiente menor de 12 años;
- No poder trabajar debido a una discapacidad física o mental; o
- Recibir beneficios de Asistencia Temporal para Familias Necesitadas (TANF) de Work First New Jersey (WFNJ) (asistencia en efectivo).
